Girl's Dress Code

It is our desire that the students of Spring Hill Christian Academy reflect the Lord Jesus Christ in their appearance. Our dress code is designed to ensure that our students are dressed appropriately for the classroom, field trip, or any other activity sponsored by the Academy. The Academy reserves the right to handle questionable cases not specifically outlined in the dress code policy on an individual basis.

Girls PreK3 through Fifth Grade

Note: All polo dresses, jumpers and skirts must be below the top of the knee

Daily Wear Attire (Non-Chapel Days):

- Light blue monogrammed polo shirt
- Plaid skirt (below the top of the knee)

PreK3, PreK4, K5 Daily Wear Exception:

- Navy blue walking shorts (to the knee) may be worn by PreK's and K5

PreK3, PreK4, K5 Chapel Day Attire:

- Navy blue polo dress with SHCA monogram

First through Fifth Grade Chapel Day Attire:

- Plaid jumper (below the top of the knee)
- White monogrammed Peter Pan blouse

All PreK3 through Fifth Grade Girls uniform item requirements:

- Long sleeved solid white, light blue or navy shirts may be worn under regular uniform attire. Collar may be crew or turtleneck. This is to accommodate during cold weather.
- Shirts worn under the school uniform must be tucked in so as not to be visible.
- Solid navy blue waist-length cardigan sweater or SHCA (only) jacket for classroom use.
- **Only SHCA-branded outerwear is permitted for classroom use. No other logos are permitted.**
- **SHCA “hoodie” style outerwear is no longer permitted for school use.**
- Solid color no-show socks, ankle socks, knee socks or black, white or navy blue tights. Socks must be a matching pair.
- Navy blue or black “Bike” shorts are suggested to be worn under skirts and jumpers.
- Navy blue, black or white leggings may be worn in cold weather (no patterns, lace or netting styles).
- Predominantly solid color tennis shoes with no characters or light up soles. Solid color laces.
- Blue or black Mary Jane style shoes on chapel day.
- Sandals are not allowed as footwear.
- “Hey Dude” style shoes are NOT allowed for K3-5th grade attire.
- Boots are not allowed for daily or chapel wear - EXCEPT for dress boots that may be worn in cold weather only (Cold weather is usually in January – February only).
 - Dress boots are leather boots with no visible fur, laces, pom-poms, etc. that are intended to look casual.
 - Combat, Cowboy, or lace-up style boots are not acceptable for school uniform attire.

2026 - 2027 Girl's Dress Code – PreK 3 through 5th Grade (Cont'd.)

General Dress Code Guidelines for all K3-12th Grade Girls:

- Hairstyles must be in good taste. Girls are not allowed to alter the color of their hair from a natural color.
- Hair must be styled so bangs are not covering the eyes.
- No bandanas or handkerchiefs. Hair acceptance is at the discretion of the administration.
- Makeup and fake nails cannot be used for girls under Sixth Grade.
- No fake eyelashes.
- Nail polish and length must be in good taste. No loud colors (neon colors, black, etc.) are permitted.
- Bracelets must be limited to one per arm/One watch
- One necklace may be worn for girls Sixth Grade and above. No choker-style necklaces are permitted.
- Earrings are to be limited to two per ear. One cartilage piercing per ear is permitted. No ear cuffs or wraps.
- Hoop earrings are to be no larger than a quarter in diameter. No dangling earrings larger than the diameter of a quarter are permitted.
- No gauge earrings are permitted.
- Body piercing, nose piercing, or tattoos of any kind are not permitted.
- Students are not permitted to write or draw on themselves.
- Rings are limited to one per hand.

Sporting Event Attire

All students are expected to dress modestly at all times, including sporting events.

Boys are not to wear “muscle” shirts, jeans with holes, rips/tears, or clothing with inappropriate verbiage.

Girls are not to wear tight or revealing clothing, no exposed mid-ribs, or jeans with holes/ rips/tears, or clothing with inappropriate verbiage.

Students dressed with school-issued SHCA shirt or outerwear will be admitted free.

Student attire permitted at sporting events is at the discretion of SHCA administration or other designated personnel. Their decision is final.

Field Trip/Dress Down Attire for All Students

Field trips or special activities: Regular uniform or uniform walking shorts with school issued field trip t-shirt may be worn by all students during designated field trip or school activities. When this applies it will be announced by the teacher. Usual footwear policy per grade level will apply unless otherwise stated. When blue jeans are permitted for these kinds of trips, they must be blue, loose-fitting (“skinny jeans” or “boyfriend jeans” are not permitted). Jeans must not have holes or be low-rise style.

Lunch Box, Book Bag and Personal Items Policy

Lunch Boxes or Bags

Students are to use only boxes or bags that have no characters, pictures or slogans.

Book Bags

Students are to use only bags that have no characters, pictures or slogans. Students are not to have rolling book bags due to excessive wear on the facilities and difficulty of getting these types of bags up the stairs.

Per the Hernando County Fire Marshall’s inspection review of our property, SHCA students are not to carry to their backpacks from class to class. Students must carry their books and materials to class. The purpose of this policy is to reduce the interruptions to evacuating the property should the situation arise.

Backpacks are to be emptied and placed on the hooks provided in the hallways. Middle & High School students are to use their lockers to store all daily class materials.

Personal Items - Students are not to bring toys, games or other personal items that are not part of the supply list that was distributed at the time of enrollment.
